What is Linux?

- Family of operating systems based around the Linux kernel
 - Created by Linus Torvalds in 1991
 - Distributions differ in filesystem layout, package manager, default applications and configurations, etc.
- Frequently used for servers, less frequently on the desktop
- Valued for simplicity, performance, customizability, and privacy







What is free and open source software?

- Anyone is able to view, modify, and redistribute the source code with few or no restrictions
 - Linux kernel
 - GNU coreutils
 - o Git
 - Blender
 - Chromium, Firefox
 - Language implementations (gcc, cpython, rustc, nodejs, etc)
- Copyleft derivatives must use the same license as the original
